January 2010 Summary

2004 - 38 MRSA §1610 *Electronic Waste*, Maine's extended producer responsibility (EPR) "E-Waste Law" enacted.

- Scope of products televisions & computer monitors
- Covered sectors household only

January 18, 2006 - manufacturer responsibility starts

 $2009- {\rm Statute} \ {\rm amended}$

- Scope of products expanded to include desktop printers, game consoles and digital picture frames as of 1/1/10
- \$3000 manufacturer annual registration fee begins 7/1/10 to support DEP's program implementation duties.

Recycling rate	Estimated capture rate
2006 – 3.20 pounds per capita	43% monitors, 44% TVs
2007 – 3.61 pounds per capita	48% monitors, 46% TVs
2008 – 4.06 pounds per capita	50% monitors, 51% TVs
2009 - 6.19 pounds per capita during the first 6 months	

This includes just the weight of televisions and computer monitors recycled. Computers (a.k.a. CPUs, the central processing unit) are often picked up and recycled by the consolidators because they have a net positive commodity value, but the weight of computers recycled is not reported because it is outside the scope of manufacturer responsibility in Maine's household e-waste recycling program.

Maine DEP: Sets standards for collection, consolidation & recycling; approves consolidators and allowable costs; manages all data on manufacturers, brands and program performance; provides training to municipalities; and conducts compliance and enforcement.
