For soils, DES makes the determination based upon review of analyses of the soil and comparison of the contaminant level with the Risk S-2 standard for soils in the “NHDES Contaminated Site Risk Characterization and Management Policy (RCMP)”, revised May 2007. For groundwater, DES makes a determination based upon a review of the analyses of the groundwater and comparison to the GW-1 Standard in Table 2 of the RCMP, which is based upon use of groundwater as drinking water.
