#### Oversight Responsibilities

- If PCBs are detected at levels greater than 50 ppm, Notify TSCA for oversight.
  - The State can assist with review of submittals to TSCA prior to submittal.
- If PCBs are detected at levels less than 50 ppm, State will provide oversight.
  - · VRAP Program.
  - Uncontrolled Sites Program.
  - RCRA Corrective Action Program.

### SOIL – Remedial Action Guidelines (RAGs)

By Scenario

Residential (non restricted use) – 2.4 mg/kg Outdoor Commercial Worker – 12 mg/kg Park User – 4.1 mg/kg

Excavation or construction worker – 6.5 mg/kg (single contaminant only)

# Groundwater – Maximum Exposure Guidelines (MEGs)

0.5 parts per billion (ppb)

#### Building Materials Clean Up Guideline

1 part per million (ppm) based on TSCA guidance

#### Clean Up Options

Removal – any remedial action that does not reach the RAG residential standard, MEG, or 1 ppm building material guideline will require institutional controls.

Cover/Encapsulation - Institutional controls and long term maintenance will be required to protect the cover/ encapsulation system.

#### **Disposal Options**

- Greater than 50 ppm "Hazardous Waste"
  NO Maine disposal facilities
- Less than 50 ppm "Special Waste"
  YES Some Maine landfills will accept this material
